With 33 years of experience in public education, Wayne Barker, has served in a variety of capacities from teacher and coach to administrator and superintendent in school districts throughout northern and central Indiana. Barker began his career as a high school business teacher and coach at Carroll High School in Fort Wayne, Ind. He is currently the Superintendent of Northwest Allen County Schools.

"As a longtime member of the Northwest Allen County School Board and its current president, I am pleased and gratified that NACS Superintendent Wayne Barker has been named the 2023 Superintendent of the Year by the Indiana Association of Public Schools Superintendents," said Ron Felger, president, NACS Board of Schools Trustees. Prior to his current position Mr. Barker served as superintendent of Schools for School City of Mishawaka and he served as superintendent for Bluffton-Harrison Metropolitan School District. Mr. Barker is recognized throughout the state for his development and implementation of educational programming that promotes effective instruction, sustainable student engagement, and strong academic achievement. Wayne has been an active member of the IAPSS serving in a variety of leadership positions with the association. Wayne currently is the District II Chairperson.

Barker obtained his Bachelor of Science in business education from Ball State University in 1989 and his Master of Science in administrative leadership from Indiana-Purdue University Fort Wayne in 1998. Later he completed his specialist in education degree (Ed.S.) in educational leadership, thus, acquiring his superintendent's license in 2006.
